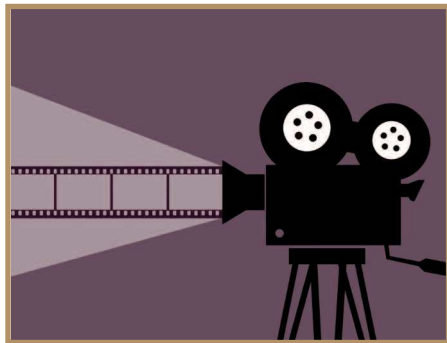

The History of Father's Day

"Mother's Day" caught on right away, thanks in large part to associations with retailers, who saw great potential for profit in the holiday. The campaign to celebrate the nation's fathers did not meet with the same enthusiasm - perhaps because "fathers haven't the same sentimental appeal that mother's have". On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event in honor of fathers, but it was a one-time event and not an annual holiday. The next year, a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, shopkeepers, the YMCA, and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington state celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910. Slowly, the holiday spread. Many men, however, continued to disdain the day, believing it to be a "sentimental attempts to domesticate manliness with flowers and gift-giving, often paid for by the father himself". During the 1920s a movement arose to scrap Mother's Day and Father's Day altogether in favor of a single holiday, Parent's Day. However, the Great Depression derailed the effort to combine and de-commercialize the holidays, as retailers used the holiday to drum up business.

When World War II began, advertisers began to argue that celebrating Father's Day was a way to honor American troops and support the war effort. By the end of the war, Father's Day may not have been a federal holiday, but it was a national institution. In 1972, Richard Nixon signed a proclamation making Father's Day a federal holiday at last. Today, economists estimate that Americans spend more than \$1 billion each year in Father's Day gifts. Today, the day honoring father's is celebrated in the United States on the third Sunday of June, Father's Day 2021 occurs on Sunday, June 20. - History.com
